- 5. GUEST SPEAKERS -

Louise Johnston, Pamela Kolochuk, Sandy Nemeth and Jeff Anderson from the LRSD School Board speaking about Bill 64: Education Modernization Ace which talks about **better education** starts today and putting students first

- Feels this is an insulting slogan especially considering COVID where the division really put efforts into keeping students safe but this is done **everyday**
- Students are always at the center of the organizational chart
- Bill 64 puts everything into one system and is then housed centrally and run by the government
- 15 regions that would have 100,388 student, 247 schools (Winnipeg, St. James, Louis Riel, Pembina Trails, Seven Oaks, River East Transcona) vs Brandon
 - Creates a large discrepancy between the how many students a single elected parent would be advocating for
- A single director would be in position to oversee the entire region no trustees and no school community councils
 - o Parents would now take on this role
- Parents, teachers and administrators are asking questions of the MLAs but no response is being received
 - O How will our local needs be considered and met?
 - O How will these changes address student achievement and gaps?
 - How will these changes address supporting schools, engaging parents?

- O What happens to French immersion?
 - Will directors and members of the PACE speak French and understand the immersion pedagogy?
 - If larger classes lead to less contact time with teacher, what is the impact on language acquisition?
 - Will we still have single track French immersion programs? (This is only in LRSD at this time.)
- School Community Council (SCC) Today, we do fundraising, ground/school yard enhancements, staff appreciation etc
 - With Bill 64: School programming and policies, staff hiring and evaluations, student achievement, capital projects, student transportation etc.
- Provincial Advisory Council on Education 15 people, 1 from each region (elected) from this
 15, two would be elected to the PEA board to represent the province
- Concerns:
 - 15 parents will make up the PACE. From PACE 2 parents will be appointed to sit on the PEA board. 2 parents to represent the entire province of Manitoba
 - For our region, 247 schools and more than 100,000+ students, there will be 1 parent eleceted.
- What are people talking about?
 - Responsibility is on parents
 - Equality vs equity "one size fits all" approach
 - o Centralization of decision-making and procurement of supplies and services
 - Ignoring the impact of poverty on student success
 - What happens to the existing support programs run by the division for areas where they know there is a need?
 - o Loss of democratically elected representation and oversight
 - Loss of input by community members in running of schools
 - Emphasis on standardized testing as determinant of success of the school and public ed in MB
 - o Impact on the high-quality French immersion program in LRSD
 - K-12 review recommendations were ignored
 - Removal of school principals from the teacher's union
- Action: Read for yourself and ask questions

Bill 64 will establish significant changes such as:

- ▶ The Education Act
- A Provincial Education Authority on or before November 2021 to oversee all K-12 education in the province
- A new provincial governance structure that eliminates school divisions (except the DSFM) and replaces them with 15 regions by July 1, 2022



Questions

- How do some of the larger metro areas operate with some of the same single, central operations? Seems like there might be some financial impacts to a single, streamlined system.
 - Louise: Aware of other areas where this has failed. Division is looking at what is best for LRSD. "One size fits all" doesn't work and in speaking to colleagues in other provinces, haven't found savings or evidence of improvement.
 - Sandy: Vancouver, Calgary and Edmonton still have an elected metro school board.
 Bill 64 removes the boards. In those communities, there is still an elected advocate who ensures that there is a voice at the table.
 - K-12 recommendations advocated for a diversity of voices
 - There are many appointed positions but few that are elected.


