Classroom Communities enriched by Aboriginal Perspectives ...for Aboriginal Students




A Grade 9 Program in select high schools will

...frame a vision of students' potential
...increase belonging and community
...strengthen relationships between school and family
...enrich student learning and engagement through
traditional teachings, supports and opportunities
...support a successful transition to high school

Which Grade 9 credits will be offered through ECHO?

- This may vary between schools
- In most cases ELA, Math, Science and Social Studies are delivered within the ECHO program
- · Courses will run in both first and second semester
- Additional courses in grade 9 may be part of ECHO or within regular programming.

...The additional 4 courses in grade 9 will be Physical Education and 3 electives



Why consider an ECHO educational experience?

- I value an Aboriginal perspective to enrich my education
- I value a supportive relationship with an Aboriginal teacher as my primary teacher, advocate, and role model
- I value a smaller classroom that emphasizes relationships, community, acceptance, connection, and opportunities
