STUDENT PROGRAM

Early Childhood Educator

- Prepares students for employment as Childcare Assistants or for further post-secondary training to become Early Childhood Educators or related fields including Social Work, Teaching, Human Ecology
- 65 % in each course allows for direct entry to Term 2 of RRC ECE program
- 2 days per week at a daycare centre, 3 days in classroom
- Motivation, creativity and an aptitude for working with children
- Child Abuse Registry and Criminal Records Check are required

- Off-site Work Practicum is not a component of this program
