Final Assessments

 - In Grade 9 no exams
 - Grade 10 and 11 can be exams but all are 10% (Grade 10) and 15% maximum in Grade 11.
 Scheduled during their regular class time (no 2-3 parters allowed). Limited to class time duration.
 - Provincials exams consistent throughout
 Division (English, Math, Français for emergent –
 20% each)
 - Grade 12 Some sciences but not all
 - Vocational courses, film production are project/process based assessments

 - 1. Grade 9 exams 10% value
 - 2. Grade 10 12 10-15% exam values
 - 3. Assessments done in the classroom
