d. 2025/26 Grade 11 & 12 Student Trip

- i. Questions arose around cost and size.
- ii. Next year's destination Martinique
 - 1. Had a preliminary meeting to gauge the level of interest.

- 2. Research undertaken on meaningful trip opportunities. Explored opportunities through Evolve that provide emphasis on culture, history and volunteering. Martinique selected given cultural aspects and alignment with being an UNESCO school.
- 3. Due to emphasis to be engaged with local community, to make it meaningful smaller group size lent itself better.
- 4. Meeting with students undertaken and then with parents.
- Out of 80 students that attended had about 60+ parents completing a survey. Different options provided. Approximately 50+ indicated interest.
- 6. Waiting for paperwork to be approved to move forward. Expect towards end of February.
- 7. Cost just under \$5,000.
- 8. Will explore with Evolve whether able to accommodate two groups to open up more spots. To be explored.

- No exam policy, but on evaluation. Have a wide variety of evaluations undertaken in school.
- Have CAT (similar to Grade 12 testing). Province has three exams that reflect process of writing.
- Semester end/larger evaluations lead up to preparation for Grade 12.
- Pilot exams may be available for students when available.
- Important to note journey since COVID Especially this year with new learning about power school, Wed collaboration morning staff getting together to explore evaluations and approach.
- Lot's of discussion on how to prepare and teaching around how we learn and retain information.
