Discovering our demographics and thinking about what we can do to encourage our families to participate. Read Article together. Discuss.

- discussed the student demographics at Ecole Varennes and ways to work towards having Ecole Varennes better reflect the demographics of the students/families.
- Food requirements have quadrupled in the past year.
- How do we engage families from different socio-economic backgrounds?
 - o Anonymous Survey to try to determine the barriers to participation

FAST program to begin on May 4thth and will run until June 15th (targeted for K/1)

MYSP for LRSD - deferred to next meeting

Lunch fees will be \$90 per student next year from \$100 this year. There is a divisional family cap on lunch fees.

New Business (30 min)

<u>T-shirts</u> for students for 20th anniversary of LRSD (Eileen and Crista) (10 minutes) Potentially look at gifting a shirt to everyone but have an option on the order form for others to gift or sponsor a shirt.

- This would be a large expense for the PAC are there other places where the
 money would be better spent? Could we do something less costly that students
 would appreciate, potentially instead of t-shirts Tattoos; Ecole Varennes stickers,
 stickers for water bottles, backpack tags with Ecole Varennes logo on them?
- Decision to leave the t-shirts for now and not pursue for next year.

Mabel's Labels – update (Eileen) Eileen provided Amy with posters to advertise and the

suggested wording to be put into the weekly email updates.

- Eileen to look into if they can do a Dolphin sticker and/or bag tag.
- Eileen to send images for social media to Amy to advertise the fundraiser.

<u>Peak of the Market</u> – Agreed that is the fundraiser that best fits the school's needs, it has been done before and the school already has an account - Charlene to send Eileen the log in credentials and Eileen will take care of signing us up for a fundraiser in the 2023/24 school year. Eileen can run with organizing this.

- Would need 3-4 adult volunteers to assist with unloading the veggies when delivered.
- Grades 7/8 can assist with unloading and organizing.
- Rob and Meghan volunteered to deliver orders to those who don't have access to vehicles.

Other Fundraising Ideas (10 minutes) -quick go over but need someone to be the lead to examine this further.

Discussed as possible activities:

- Craft/paint nite potentially look into doing a paint night in the fall, could maybe do this at the AGM night in September.
 - Would include children and adults.
 - Would be a 2023/2024 activity.
- **Friday night drop-in fee** and a bunch of games/activities/crafts/sports in the gym, maybe a movie, etc.
 - Discussed doing this as a movie night with popcorn, candy and drinks for sale. Possibly small "rental fee" for families to use the mats.
 - o Requires a lot of volunteer commitment to assist with set up and take down/clean up of gym, making popcorn etc.
 - o Families can volunteer to assist with set up and take down and every member of the volunteer's family gets free popcorn and a drink. This would make it more accessible to everyone.
 - Different nights have different movie ratings so older children and younger children would have movies that are appropriate and geared towards their interests.
 - Likely a 2023/2024 activity.
- Freezie fundraiser Please do it on a Friday.
 - Possible issues with garbage left in school yard so would need volunteers to clean up after.
 - Could charge \$1.25 and kids who bring back the empty wrappers get .25 back. Might be a solution for children who aren't able to afford/forget to bring money that day as those who collect enough wrappers would be able to afford a freezie.
 - Possibly have one of the grades responsible for school yard clean up after.
 - Could be done this year. We could do 2 in June. Need a committee to assist with setting up.

To discuss at a future meeting:

- baseball ticket fundraiser. I emailed Goldeyes to see if they give discounted rates to schools. \$13/each possible fundraiser or draw
- craft packs to sell to the students.
- student art gallery
- calendar with student artwork

Educator Appreciation Committee (Charlene and Kate) (2 minutes):

• Staff Appreciation Week – Kate organizing for first week of May. Monday and Tuesday will be snacks. Wednesday is Taco bar. Volunteers signed up in person during spring concert as well as on Sign Up Genius.

Possible Constitutional Changes (5 minutes):

- Possible name change this would take effect on Article 1 of our constitution this would need to be amended at the September AGM. Suggested names: Ecole Varennes School Community Councils (is done is SK and ON), Ecole Varennes Home and School Committee, Home-School Partnership Committee
- Increase engagement perhaps staff/students to present and we can really target each grade band each meeting (all still invited); change of time (maybe do over supper- share cost of meals); reduce the number of meetings (AGM in September and then maybe only 4-5 minutes throughout the year, reports shared on "off-months") this would need to be decided before the end of the year as we would need to change the constitution Article 10.B.2 these amendments need to be made now and then presented and voted on at AGM. Potentially have potluck meetings over dinner.
