Volunteers: those who enter into or offer their services without expectation of reward in order to contribute to their community's well-being.

Canada has envied international reputation for volunteerism. Because of our altruistic nature, communities and their projects have been able to advance and to flourish in ways that no dollar value can measure.

Many volunteers will tell you that the experience is humbling. Though they enter volunteer service with little expectation of reward, they often witness the paradox of the experience: the more you give yourself, the more you get in return.

Collège Jeanne-Sauvé has embarked on a program of volunteerism to actively engage our student population in giving back to their community. Over the years, our students have accumulated tens of thousands of volunteer hours!!!! What a great accomplishment.

Our goal:

- To register all grade 9-12 students to accumulate a minimum of 20 volunteer hours per year as part of a compulsory unit of the Vie-Travail Transition 40S course (Life Skills 40S). This course is taught by Student Services teachers and integrated students' courses throughout the year. This course accumulates experience hours over a 4-year period for course accreditation in their graduating year.
- To encourage all grade 12 students to continue accumulating their volunteer hours for either
- 1) Community Services Student Initiated Program (S.I.P.)- accredited Volunteer Course (110 hours) or
- 2) A collection of community services experiences to use in bursary applications.
- 3) Students who complete the Vie-Travail Transition 40S credit along with a Community Services S.I.P. will receive a Community Services Diploma at Graduation.

(NOTE: Volunteer hours can only be applied to one program- no double dipping.)

If you have already begun volunteering this school year, you need only to fill in the inserted CJS registration form and submit it to your Student Services Advisor.

If you are just beginning your volunteer experiences, you need to find a volunteer placement. Here's what to do? Look around your immediate community. Do you know of any senior citizens in their own homes who could help with cleaning, shopping, yard work? Do you know any sports teams who need a coach/ a manager? A day care/ church/ community club who could use an extra hand? Do you participate in a school committee where you are giving your time to help out? Student Services has numerous placements available. Check out the Volunteer Billboards for ideas. And talk to your advisor. Everyone can make a difference!
