The 2023-2024 school year was the first year in the four-year cycle of the new Multi-Year Strategic Plan (MYSP) for the Louis Riel School Division. Here is some of the staff learning and student progress we explored last year, as it relates to the priorities listed, which align with <u>divisional goals</u>.

Priority 1 – Fostering Independence of Students of All Abilities

1a) Deepen understandings of neurodiversity, trauma and other influences on learning. (1.3, 3.3)
