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

In 2007, Berwick Nova Scotia, after a new student at their school was bullied for wearing a pink shirt, two grade 12 students bought 50 pink shirts and encouraged their classmates to wear pink. The next day they went to distribute the shirts and to their surprise the majority of students arrived wearing pink! With that act of kindness, Pink Shirt

Day was born. Many countries now recognize specific days for raising awareness about the prevention of bullying and promoting kindness and inclusion. In Canada, many students have

heard the Pink Shirt Day message from kindergarten through to their high school graduation.

#### LRSD Kindergarten to Grade 12 Powwow Club

The Powwow Club aims to provide cultural teachings and immersive experiences for participants. The club will be divided into three groups:

- Group 2: Grade 7-12 Instruction for Fancy Shawl and Grass Dance
- Group 3: Caregivers will have the opportunity to spend time with Kookum Hilda for community teachings and conversations

We will provide a light snack for participants and caregivers during the sessions.

Understanding that transportation may be a barrier for some families, once registration forms are returned, we will collaborate with schools to organize a transportation plan if needed.

Please note that Regalia making will not be conducted during these sessions to allow participants and caregivers to fully immerse themselves in the experience. Separate sessions for Regalia making will be organized at different times and locations, both during the day and in the evenings.

We are all excited to celebrate our learning and share with you our gift of music. Our concert on **Thursday, February 8th, 2024** will feature the Grade 6/7 L Guitar Class and Grade 7/8H and 7/8J Band. Our evening concert will be at 7:00 pm in the Glenwood School gym. Students are asked to arrive at school at 6:30 pm. We ask that all students and audience members remain for the duration of the show. What to Wear: All students (6-8) are asked to wear traditional concert dress - plain white top and black bottom. The white top need not be a dress shirt or blouse, although it must be, "logo-free" if possible (ie: no shirts with designs or logos on the front). The black bottom may be anything black – dress pants, skirts, jeans or sweats. Also, black footwear would be preferable. We are working hard to make this a high-quality, high-caliber learning experience for everyone. Part of what contributes to the visual quality of the performance is how the students appear on stage. We appreciate your help in ensuring your child is dressed appropriately for the performance.

**Parking:** Parking in and around the school is limited as most of our staff will also be in attendance. #### Changes to the Report Card for Students on Targeted Intervention Plans

As we aim to bring practices in line with a new MEECL (Manitoba Education and Early Childhood Learning) directive, starting with the Term 2 report card in March 2024, the IEP (Individualized Education Plan) check box located in each subject area will no longer be selected to indicate the presence of a TIP (Targeted Intervention Plan) or IEP for students. The IEP check box will only be used on the K-8 report card to indicate that a CMP (Curricular Modified Plan) is in place for eligible students in that subject area.

Although we expect this to affect very few students, it is important to communicate changes to the entire community. This means that students who were evaluated on the goals of their Targeted Intervention Plan will now be assessed only on the grade level outcomes of the grade in which they are enrolled.

Below is information from the Province explaining the K to 8 Ordinal Scale (4, 3, 2, 1, ND). It is provided as a reference, and it has not changed.

# The Louis Riel School Division Policy Review: School Relations with Police Services

At the January 16 Public meeting, the Louis Riel School Division Board of Trustees passed for First Reading Policy KLG: School Relations with Police Services. The policy was presented to the Board following a year-long process reviewing our legislated responsibilities as a public school system, research into similar policies in place nationally and internationally and an examination of protocols developed by government bodies and individual school districts.

Please call the school office if your child is going to be absent or late. Office hours are 8:00 am to 4:00 pm. An answering machine is available for you to leave a message if it is more convenient for you to call outside of office hours.

If a student is absent and the parent or guardian has not called the school, we will call home or work to determine that the child's absence is known and that he/she is safe. This pertains to all grades from K to Gr. 8 and includes those days when Junior High students are to be at Industrial Arts or Home Economics classes. Please call us if your child is going to be absent, as this saves both a great deal of time and worry! Thanks!

Any student arriving after 9:00 am and 12:45 pm must report to the office upon arrival, otherwise the student will be reported absent, and an unnecessary telephone call will be made to the parent.

Occasionally parents wish to pick up their children prior to our regular dismissal times. Parents are asked to make arrangements to come into the school and pick up their children at the office. Please do not ask your child to wait at the door, or on the playground, or go to the classroom.



#### Grade Eight Transition to High School

With only a handful of months left in their grade eight year, it is time to start the transition process from Glenwood School to high school. As most of our students are within the Glenlawn Collegiate catchment area, we will be connecting with the Collegiate a number of times to ensure that there is a smooth transition that builds connections and welcomes our students to their new school.




On Wed, Feb 28th we hope you will all wear some PINK in support of the anti-bullying project and kindness for all.
