The Jan. 17 Regular Board Meeting of the Louis Riel School Division (LRSD) Board of Trustees was called to order by Sandy Nemeth, Chair, LRSD Board of Trustees at 6:31 p.m.

1.1 LRSD Land Acknowledgement

The Louis Riel School Division (LRSD) brings together a community of schools on the traditional land of the Anishinaabek, Ininewak, and Dakota. Our division is located on

the homeland of the Red River Métis. We recognize that Manitoba is also the traditional land of the Anishininwak and Dene.

We respect the treaties made on this land and acknowledge the harms and mistakes of the past and present. We dedicate ourselves to authentic alliances with Indigenous communities in a spirit of reconciliation and cooperation.

The ongoing development of LRSD's land acknowledgement is guided by our Indigenous Council of Grandmothers and Grandfathers, and we thank them for their generosity and collaboration.

3.1 News from the Board of Trustees Provided by Trustee Gerrior

• On Jan. 4, the division recognized the first National Ribbon Skirt Day.

- Starting Jan. 9, students from the Louis Riel Arts & Technology Centre have been working in the community as part of their internship experience. Thank you to the many businesses in the community who have welcomed our students.
- On Jan. 19, there will be a Math Anxiety Workshop for parents with students in Kindergarten to Grade 8 from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. in the Legacy Centre. Please visit our website to register through Eventbrite.
- The Victor H.L. Wyatt Playground Renewal project is complete, and students are thrilled.
- On Jan. 26, Manitoba Career Prospects presents the Manitoba (virtual) Career Fair from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Please visit their website to register.

3.2 News from Senior Leadership (SLT) Team Provided by Assistant Superintendent Darcy Cormack

Assistant Superintendent Cormack highlighted the following:

- Next week, the first cohort of students will travel to Kochi, Japan, for two
 months, and the second cohort of students will travel in April. Other student
 trips will take place throughout April, May, and June to Chile, Spain, Italy and
 Germany.
- The International Student Program (ISP) current enrolment is 348 students.
 There has been a steady increase in enrolment as families and students worldwide look for programming offered by LRSD. There has been a significant increase in enrolment at the Arts & Technology Centre (ATC). Additional staff has been hired for post-secondary international students with a focus on student care and well-being.
- On Oct. 24, there was an hour of Diwali celebrations enjoyed by adult students attending ATC. On Nov. 28, the students, staff, and administrators in ISP shared a celebratory dinner together. Many classrooms had potluck dinners, birthday cake celebrations, and other fun and games. Students received their first report cards before the winter break demonstrating success and initiative.
- A few highlights of amazing things happening at the René Deleurme Centre (RDC) include:
 - The Food Depot that partners with Second Harvest (Peak of the Market & Bimbo Breads) recently added a new partnership with the Leftovers Foundation. The Food Depot operates every Thursday at noon and serves approximately 40-60 community members weekly, in addition to 11

- schools. The demand for emergency hampers continues to increase. There is an emergency food cupboard available to families and individuals who can take groceries when needed.
- Other programs that run from September to December includes Full Moon Ceremonies, Breakfast and Beading programs, and community programming. We also have a Footsteps space and a clothing closet.
- The ZONE Settlement Program team has been busy with newcomers joining us in LRSD. We've had a number of school preparation information orientation sessions including driving lessons, English conversation circles, cooking and nutrition programs, youth employment and career development sessions, and parenting programs.
- We have also hosted a Community Flu and COVID-19 Vaccination Clinic in partnership with Winnipeg Regional Health Authority. Over 190 vaccinations were completed at this clinic.
- Congratulations to Melissa Brown, Manager of Community Programs at RDC and long-time partner, Bonnie Ash, Executive Director of Morrow Early Learning and Child Development for receiving the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Medal award.
- Congratulations to Dakota Collegiate for organizing a Relay For Life Youth event and raising over \$26,000 for the Canadian Cancer Society. The collegiate was also invited to MusicFest Canada, which is a tremendous honour.

7.3 Conversation with Rochelle Squires, MLA for Riel

The Chair shared highlights from the conversation with Rochelle Squires, MLA for Riel. Topics discussed included updates to infrastructure, issues around poverty, René Deleurme Centre opportunities and successes, and ventilation funding.

8. SENIOR LEADERSHIP TEAM INFORMATION TO THE BOARD

8.1 New School Update - École Sage Creek & Bonavista

Assistant Superintendent Anderson shared an update regarding the construction of the new school that will support students enrolled in the French Immersion program, who live in Sage Creek and Bonavista.

- We received the preliminary concept designs for École Sage Creek/Bonavista during the winter break. The three design options were reviewed by divisional representatives, with initial feedback shared and a preferred option identified. Refined options will be presented at a community consultation planned for Feb. 6 at 6 p.m. in the gym at École Sage Creek School. Invitations have been sent to families at École Sage Creek School (ÉSCS) and École Van Belleghem (ÉVB), as well as provincial and municipal elected officials.
- On Jan. 9, I met with the co-chairs of ÉSCS Parent Advisory Council (PAC) and I also met with the ÉVB PAC to share an update on the status of the project and to request their assistance in promoting the community consultation.
- On Jan. 9, the first meeting took place with representatives from LRSD, Number Ten Architectural Group (NTAG) and the various specialized fields (structural, electrical, mechanical, and landscape architecture). NTAG is receiving quotes from various firms for a traffic study. The division will be working with Landmark Planning to submit the Conditional Use Application and Plan Approval documents to the City of Winnipeg.
- On Jan. 16, divisional officials met with representatives from NTAG, HTFC
 Planning and Designing, the school, and the provincial government. Revised
 drawings were examined with additional feedback provided.

8.2 Collège Jeanne-Sauvé Renovation and Addition Update

Assistant Superintendent Anderson shared an update regarding the renovation and addition at Collège Jeanne-Sauvé. There are two projects taking place, a renovation of science labs in the existing part of the building, and the construction of an addition to the north of the current site.

- Work to renovate existing science labs is nearing completion. It is expected that
 the science labs will be ready to receive students by the end of February, three
 weeks later than scheduled.
- The construction of eight additional classrooms and a music room continues to run on schedule. Floors have been poured and walls are going up.

8.3 École Varennes Update

Assistant Superintendent Anderson shared an update regarding École Varennes.

- On Jan. 11, divisional officials met with representatives of NTAG to review updated designs and provide additional feedback.
- NTAG is in the process of receiving quotes from various firms for a traffic study.
- The finalized design will be presented to the community on Jan. 30 at 6 p.m. in the school gym. Invitations have been sent out to families, residents of neighbouring properties, as well as provincial and municipal elected officials.
 The school is organizing a family event to begin at 5:30 p.m., with childcare being provided during the consultation.

8.4 Collège Béliveau Renovation Update

Assistant Superintendent Anderson shared an update regarding the renovation at Collège Béliveau (CB).

- On Dec. 20, divisional officials met with Prairie Architects Inc. to view preliminary drawings and provide feedback. On Jan. 12, revised drawings were presented with additional feedback provided.
- On Jan. 13 and 16, school administration at both Windsor Park Collegiate (WPC) and CB presented the revised drawings to teacher leaders. Feedback provided will be shared with the project team and architects.
- On Jan. 16, members of the School and Classroom Support Team reviewed drawings for WPC and CB. Feedback provided will be shared with the project team and architects.
- School administration at both WPC and CB will present the revised drawings to school staff at the Jan. 24 staff meeting. Feedback provided will be shared with the project team and architects.
- Architects will continue to refine drawings over the coming month in response to community feedback, the most important opportunity being the community

consultations scheduled for Jan. 31 for the English program to be held at 296 Speers Road and Feb. 1 for the French Immersion program to be held at 1015 Cottonwood Road. Invitations have been sent out to families, staff, and municipal and provincial elected officials. Doors will open at 6 p.m. on both evenings to offer the chance to walk through the schools and become familiar with the current building layout prior to the presentations of new designs. School representatives will be on site to answer questions and provide directions. The consultations will begin at 7 p.m.

8.5 Windsor Park Collegiate Renovation Update

Superintendent Michalik shared that the renovation at WPC aligns with the update provided for CB.

8.6 J.H. Bruns Collegiate Renovation and Addition Update

Superintendent Michalik shared an update regarding the renovation and addition at J.H. Bruns Collegiate. Prior to the winter break we shared the design with the community. Now, we will engage in deeper dialogue with the province to support our need for an addition.

8.7 Marion School Renovation and Addition Update

Assistant Superintendent Cormack shared an update regarding the renovation and addition at Marion School.

- Currently we are focused on the elevator and envelope project. The exterior
 work is taking place in the daycare area, including the foundation and
 installation of the vapour barrier. Windows are being installed in classrooms
 and for the Indigenous Education Team space. In the interior, the concrete walls
 of the elevator are in place. The excavation of the crawlspace continues.
- On Jan. 16, divisional officials met for the first time with the province, Prairie
 Architects Inc., and some of the contractors regarding the design process for the
 addition. We spent time looking at three different conceptual designs.

8.8 Individualized Programing

Superintendent Michalik, Ron Cadez, Director of School & Classroom Supports, and Lisa Tymchuk, Clinical Supervisor of Developmental Supports, shared an update regarding individualized programming.

8.9 Emergency Response Planning Working Group

Superintendent Michalik will be working with the Emergency Response Planning Working Group. The initial meeting, which will take place later in January, will focus on the first of three planned actions and the development of a comprehensive emergency

management program. This meeting will focus on providing an overview of the key components of an effective emergency management program and lessons learned.
