# 3. LRSD NEWS

#### 3.1 News from the Board of Trustees Provided by Trustee Champagne

Trustee Champagne shared the following highlights:

Over the last couple months, I have visited many schools, including Dakota
Collegiate Institute, Nelson McIntyre Collegiate, Nordale School, Marion School,
Louis Riel Arts & Technology Centre, Lavallee School, École Howden and École
Julie-Riel. These visits provided an opportunity to meet staff and students and to
become better familiar with programs and activities.

- On April 22, students celebrated Earth Day which included many activities, such as displaying unique works of art in the hallways.
- Marion School is undergoing major renovations which will serve the school community well in the coming years.
- On May 2, I attended the fabulous Seussical matinee performance at Highbury School. The musical immersed us in the world of Dr. Seuss, where we revisited beloved characters such as Cat in the Hat, Horton the Elephant and JoJo. The production involved parents, students, and staff working diligently for months. There were approximately 250 students who took part in the musical; students in Grade 3 to 6 sang in the choir, while students in Grade 7 and 8 assumed theatrical roles. The quote by Dr. Seuss, "A person's a person, no matter how small" is a perfect example of supporting belonging.
- The Arts in Action exhibit took place at St. Vital Centre from May 11 to 14 and I
  was very impressed by the stunning artwork. Our students are so talented!

## 3.2 News from Senior Leadership (SLT) Team Provided by Assistant Superintendent Murray

Assistant Superintendent Murray provided the following highlights:

- This morning, Andrew Smith, Minister of Municipal Relations, shared the announcement that Collège Béliveau Parent Advisory Council will receive \$300,000 to support the community track renewal project.
- On April 26, students from Niakwa Place School provided two incredible performances of *12 Angry Villains*.
- School Engagement Officers monitor and judge school patrols, in each division, throughout the year on their performance and attention to detail. This year, School Engagement Officers awarded first place in LRSD to the school patrols at Island Lakes Community School (ILCS).
- On April 28, students in Grade 5 and 6 at ILCS worked together to put on a fundraising event in support of families affected by the earthquakes in Syria and Türkiye.
- Jianne Turtle, Grade 10 student at J.H. Bruns Collegiate, led students and staff in the creation of an impactful and interactive display in observance of National Day of Awareness and Action for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, Girls, and Two Spirits (MMIWG2S).

#### 8. SENIOR LEADERSHIP TEAM INFORMATION TO THE BOARD

### 8.1 New School Update - École Sage Creek & Bonavista

Assistant Superintendent Anderson shared an update regarding the construction of the new school that will support students enrolled in the French Immersion program, who live in Sage Creek and Bonavista.

- The province has assigned Carlito Morada, a new project manager, to this project.
- Follow-up meetings continue between Bird Construction, Number TEN
  Architectural Group (NTAG), members of the SLT, the province and Landmark
  Planning and Design. Plans continue to advance. As reported at our last
  meeting, the conditional use application and the plan approval is expected to be
  considered by the Riel Community Committee on June 19. The division will be
  receiving the structural drawing package on June 29.

### 8.2 Collège Jeanne-Sauvé Renovation and Addition Update

Assistant Superintendent Anderson shared an update regarding the renovation and addition at Collège Jeanne-Sauvé. Members of the SLT met with NTAG and Gateway Construction & Engineering to review the project schedule. Adjustments have been made to enhance the likelihood of partial occupancy by the beginning of the school year.

# 8.3 École Varennes Update

Assistant Superintendent Anderson shared an update regarding École Varennes and the need to build a new school to replace the existing school. The document detailing the request for assistance is being drafted for a meeting with government officials before the end of the school year.

### 8.4 Collège Béliveau Renovation Update

Assistant Superintendent Murray shared an update regarding the renovation at Collège Béliveau and Windsor Park Collegiate as a campus-planning project. Members of the SLT are finalizing a formal request for approval to supplement information previously provided to the province. ### 8.7 Marion School Renovation and Addition Update

Amarbeer Bhandari, Director of Facilities, Maintenance and Transportation, shared an update regarding the renovation and addition at Marion School.

#### Renovation:

- Tyndall and brick masonry veneer installation is currently underway.
- Parapet framing has been completed and the perimeter of the roof tie-in and installation is in progress.

#### Addition:

 We have received feedback regarding the concept plan presented to the Capital Planning and Project Delivery Department and will incorporate changes in the design concept. The design stage is currently at 33 per cent.

## 8.8 Intervention Study of HEPA Air Purifier units

Amarbeer Bhandari, Director of Facilities, Maintenance and Transportation, shared that the division is participating in an intervention study with the National Research Council of Canada to assess the efficacy of HEPA air purifier units to improve indoor air quality. After reviewing the building information, two LRSD schools, Minnetonka School and Victor Mager School, have been selected to participate in this intervention study. HEPA air purifier units have been placed in 20 classrooms during the study period.
