Why Summer Enrichment Program?

- Enhance students' educational experience in Canada,
- Provide students aged 10-18 with opportunities to learn beyond the traditional classroom setting,
- Explore Canadian culture in and around Winnipeg,
- Gain a deeper understanding and appreciation of Canadian summer surroundings,
- Allow students to practice their English language skills in an immersive environment,
- Meet and communicate with Canadian students and certified Canadian teachers.

Participants in the Summer Enrichment Program can expect to:

- Gain enhanced cultural enrichment experiences and language development,
- Take lessons from certified Canadian teachers,
- Obtain a certificate of completion,
- Receive a Manitoba high school credit in EAL (ESL)
- Students' may stay in LRSD homestay (additional fees apply), and will be met and welcomed at the airport upon arrival if in a LRSD homestay

Themes

The summer's International Student Program is a two to four - week long course designed to offer international students the chance to experience Canadian culture.

Each week revolves around a theme:

- Week 1 - Introduction to Canadian/Winnipeg Culture**
- Week 2 - Canadian History: People, Places, Animals**
- Week 3 - Sports, Health, and Nutrition**
- Week 4 - Environment Sustainability and Global Challenges.**

Activities

Students will participate in a variety of academic activities and field trips. A sample of the course programming includes:

Identity flag: Students create unique flags to represent their interests, ideas, and traits.

Currency unit: Students learn about Canadian money and visit the Canadian Mint.

French community: Students take a walking trip through St. Boniface to visit its many attractions and discuss the importance of the French community to Canada and Winnipeg.

Canadian citizenship: An overview of some of the concepts of Canadian citizenship, including democratic values.

Activities

Global identity: What is Canada's role in relation to the larger world? How does globalization bring us together or keep us apart? How can we work together across borders?

Traditions: We will explore unique Canadian traditions and those of students and their families.

The digital world: Students will use technology at the school's computer lab to create digital media projects such as movies and/or podcasts.
